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-ABOUT THE COLLECTION-

In recent years fine art museums have rediscovered the art of costume, its relevance and interrelationship with other media. While institutions attempt to build or refine their collections, historic examples have become increasingly difficult to find.

Assembled over a long period of time, this collection includes many items that could not be found today. The comprehensive collection we present focuses on European fashion from 1710 through 1920 and includes over 600 costumes and c. 700 accessories – primarily from France, England and America. The collection gives a summary of the development of European fashion in both centuries without a gap.

All objects are superb examples that document the evolution of dress during this period. Besides this the costumes and dresses are in an exceptional state of preservation – unchanged, the fabrics in remarkable condition with bright and fresh colours.

The collection includes an amazing array of women's dresses and gowns that document the stylistic change of each decade – important examples of 18th century dresses (ROBES A LA FRANCAISE / ROBES A L´ANGLAISE / DIRECTOIRE DRESSES), superb 19th century costumes (EMPIRE DRESSES, great BALL GOWNS of the 1850s as well as an important section of women's sporting outfits etc.), numerous complete three-piece men's suits from 1750 through the whole 19th century and extremely rare children's dresses of the 18th and 19th century. The wide range of accessories contains engageantes, fichus, corsets, hats, shoes, purses, handbags, etc.

The costumes and accessories are sold as a collection. This collection enables a museum to build up a complete costume department within one step. It will be at eye level with the leading museums collections worldwide.































